

Quizlet Guide for Parents and Students

Students should be following their homework timetable as normal. Each day you should complete one full page (minimum) of self-quizzing in your purple quiz book. If the set homework is going to take longer than a page you should focus on what you don't know. You should write the title (subject) and date at the top of each page. There should be no gaps on the page except for one line underneath the title. You should tick any correct answers and correct any incorrect answers in red pen.

During the last week of half term your homework timetable will be blank due to KO assessments that would be taking place. Use this time to go back and revise lines you have previously got wrong.

There is also the option to use Quizlet to complete your KO homework. Please see the guide below for how Quizlet can support you with your KO homework.

What is Quizlet?

Quizlet is an online study application that allows students to study 'sets' of information via learning tools and games. The website supports students with retrieval via flashcards, various games and tests. The website has seven different study modes and so students are exposed to key facts and information in a variety of different formats helping to strengthen pathways in the long-term memory. To support students on their journey to mastery all the Knowledge Organiser content for this academic year has been uploaded to Quizlet.

How to access Quizlet?

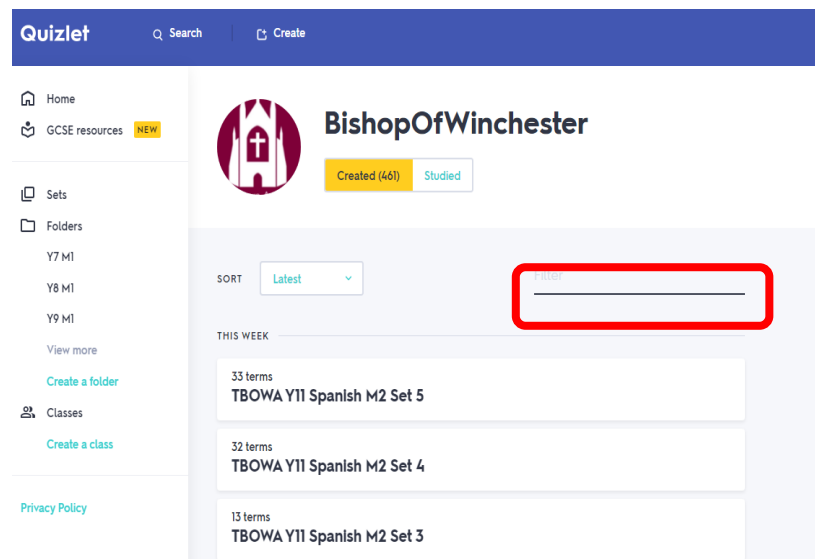
Quizlet can be accessed from any device with internet access using the web address www.quizlet.com. It can also be downloaded as an app to any smart phone/tablet.

How to use Quizlet?

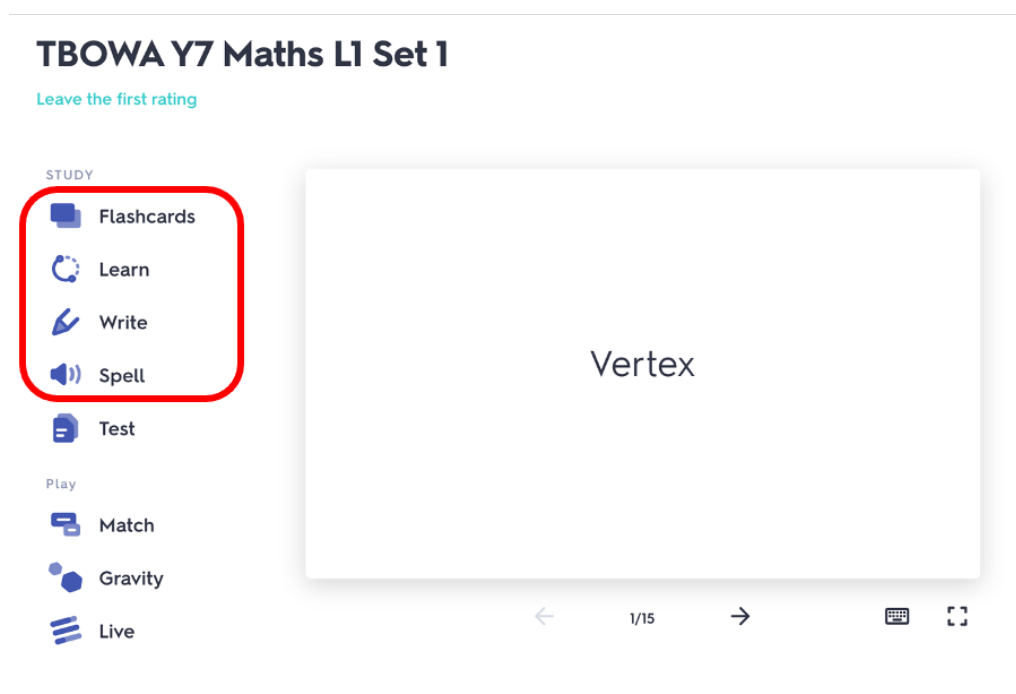
Students should have already set up accounts during mentor time last half term. If they haven't, they will need to create a free account. Please speak to your child's mentor if they are unsure how to do this. Once students have logged in, they will need to search for the BishopOfWinchester user. Students will then need to use the filter option to search for the specific term, year group and subject.



The quizlet sets are named to match the weeks of KO homework. For example, TBOWA Y7 Science L1 Set 1 is the first week of Science KO homework for Y7 in L1. The weeks match the homework timetable found in the front of students' Knowledge Organisers.



Students are then able to use the different study modes to revise the key terms for each subject.

- Flashcards – can be used to review recall of terms and definitions or questions and answers on the Quizlet website/app just as you would regular flashcards
- Learn – tests how well you have remembered each key word by asking you to first match up the definition and term (familiar) and then recall the key term independently (mastered).
- Write – users are shown a term or definition and must type the term or definition that goes with what is shown.
- Spell – the term is read out loud and students must write down the term with the correct spelling
- Test – allows students to assess how much they have learnt with a variety of different questions.
